


#### **Dr Patricia Banks – Medical Oncologist**

Medical Oncology is a specialty of medicine that deals with the investigation, diagnosis and treatment of people with cancer or suspected cancer.

Medical oncology encompasses <u>chemotherapy</u>, <u>immunotherapy</u>, <u>hormone therapy</u> and other drugs in the treatment of cancer.

#### **Next Meeting**

Our next monthly Support Group meeting will be held on **Friday 22<sup>th</sup> March 2024** at the Belmont Park Pavilion at the usual time of 10.00 am. (Due to 29<sup>th</sup> being Good Friday).

Our presenter in March will be Dr Patricia Banks, a medical oncologist who treats all solid organ malignancies. She completed her medical degree at the University of Queensland and undertook physician training in Geelong, including a Clinical Diploma in Palliative Medicine. Dr Banks currently works as a medical oncologist at the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre in the genitourinary and melanoma services, University Hospital Geelong and the Familial Cancer Centre. Patricia has a keen interest in clinical research and genetics.

#### **February Meeting**

The meeting was chaired by Graham with 53 members attending including (near record) nine newbies.

A feedback session was held with good discussions with participants Chairman Graham, Max, Garry (6 months PSA undetectable), Dave, Jamie W, Jamie H, Jamie W, Max H, Mike Jolly, who mentioned he was going into respite care. Topics included:

- Castrate resistant PCa and the new ADT treatment, Darolutamide newly included on the PBS.
- PET scans at McKellar Centre.
- Artificial sphincters.
- Rising PSA and Lucrin treatment.

#### Newbies:

Ulrich said he was diagnosed 20 years ago and PSA is still undetectable.

Ronnie said he had symptoms he describes as troubles with going to the toilet. He had scans and MRI followed by a blood test which revealed a PSA of 8 and Gleason score of 9

Max talked about his operation and how he was faring now.

#### **Getting-to-know a member**

Murray (our treasurer) was interviewed by Ian. Murray revealed where he went to school, how he drove to WA in a VW Beetle and that he towed a caravan to Geelong from Queensland and stayed.

#### Presentation



The presentation was conducted by Greg Duff of Beach Wealth Advisers. Greg enlightened us on the procedures and pitfalls relating to finances on entry to residential aged care. He stated that the need for aged care can be unexpected and that there can be time pressures in making the big lifestyle and financial decisions related to selecting and moving to a residential aged care facility.

Greg talked about structuring assets correctly while a resident is in 'respite' (typically the first 28 days of residency in the Aged Care facility) to ensure that the future cost of care is minimised while cash flow requirements are met by maximising social security entitlements.

Greg explained the industry jargon in plain terms to increase our knowledge and understanding of the transition process and the relevant legislation.

Mike was at our last meeting and said he was going into respite care, which, obviously was not for long.
